

Pronouns:

Pronouns are words that are used to replace or refer to nouns. They help to avoid repetition and make sentences more concise. There are several types of pronouns in the English language:

1. Personal Pronouns - Personal pronouns are used to refer to people, animals, or things. They include:
 - Subjective pronouns: I, you, he, she, it, we, they
 - Objective pronouns: me, you, him, her, it, us, them
 - Possessive pronouns: mine, yours, his, hers, its, ours, theirs
 - Reflexive pronouns: myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, ourselves, themselves
2. Demonstrative Pronouns - Demonstrative pronouns are used to point to specific people, animals, or things. They include: this, that, these, those.
3. Indefinite Pronouns - Indefinite pronouns are used to refer to people, animals, or things in a general or unspecific way. They include: anybody, anyone, anything, everybody, everyone, everything, nobody, no one, nothing, somebody, someone, something.

Here are some examples

1. Personal Pronouns - These are used to refer to specific people or things.
 - I, you, he, she, it, we, they

Example: He is my brother.

2. Possessive Pronouns - These are used to indicate ownership or possession.
 - Mine, yours, his, hers, its, ours, theirs

Example: The book is hers.

3. Reflexive Pronouns - These are used to refer back to the subject of a sentence.
 - Myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, ourselves, themselves

Example: She hurt herself.

4. Demonstrative Pronouns - These are used to indicate or point to a specific person or thing.
 - This, that, these, those

Example: That is a beautiful flower.

5. Interrogative Pronouns - These are used to ask questions.

- Who, whom, whose, what, which

Example: Whose bike is this?

6. Indefinite Pronouns - These are used to refer to nonspecific people or things.

- Anybody, anyone, anything, somebody, someone, something, everybody, everyone, everything, nobody, no one, nothing

Example: Somebody left their umbrella here.

7. Relative Pronouns - These are used to introduce a clause that modifies a noun or pronoun.

- Who, whom, whose, that, which

Example: The book that you gave me is excellent.
